Sarnia-Lambton Economic Partnership announces recipients of Starter Company Plus grants

November 14, 2019

The Sarnia-Lambton Economic Partnership is announcing that six local businesses have been selected to participate in the 2019-2020 Starter Company Plus Program.

Offered by the Sarnia-Lambton Economic Partnership's Business Enterprise Centre, Starter Company Plus is a joint initiative with the Ministry of Economic Development, Job Creation, and Trade that is designed to support entrepreneurs by combining grant funding with coaching, mentorship, and community support.

Through the program, six local businesses will each receive a \$5,000 grant to help start a new venture or grow an existing business while also accessing personalized coaching and mentorship from business leaders in the Sarnia-Lambton area. The six businesses will also meet monthly over the course of the year-long program to share learnings and best practices with one another.

"The Sarnia-Lambton Economic Partnership is committed to providing programming that fosters new businesses and entrepreneurship and also supports those small and medium enterprises that already make up the backbone of our economy," said Stephen Thompson, Chief Executive Officer of the Economic Partnership.

"Starter Company Plus will provide the tools and resources to help these six businesses in their endeavours, and we are pleased that we will be able to offer this program for the foreseeable future as well," Thompson added.

The six businesses participating in the program were chosen by a volunteer committee of business and community leaders.

Of successful applicants, four are engaging in growing an existing business, while two of the participants are starting a new business and represent a balance of urban and rural parts of the County.

"Whether it is growing an existing business or starting a new one from scratch, the importance of entrepreneurship to the Sarnia-Lambton community can not be overstated, and we strive every day to support entrepreneurs and their ideas," said Thompson before adding "Starter Company Plus is a program we are proud to be able to offer our area's innovators."
