

ABOUT LAMBTON SHORES

Lambton Shores is a municipality in Lambton County, Ontario, Canada, on the southeastern shores of Lake Huron. Comprised of six unique communities, the Municipality is approximately 331 km² in size and is internationally renowned for its beautiful freshwater Blue Flag Beach, Carolinian woodland forests, trails, and spectacular sunsets.

Arkona is rich in history and known for its scenic waterfalls, orchards and a wide variety of medical services. It is an ideal location for businesses whose customer base is willing to travel for excellent customer service and small town hospitality.

Forest is a thriving retail community with historic architecture, offering a blend of quaint shops, services and restaurants. Forest is home to a cluster of industrial manufacturing companies and the Forest Industrial Park

Grand Bend is the tourism hotspot of Lambton Shores, with a year-round population of approximately 2,000, swelling considerably in the summer months. Grand Bend's main street has a mix of restaurants, shops, and nightlife destinations leading to its internationally recognized Blue Flag Beach and Marina. Grand Bend is a regional cultural centre with

art galleries, museums, a playhouse, winery, motorplex and plenty of activities for nature enthusiasts at the Pinery Provincial Park

Ipperwash is a small beach community located on the shore of Lake Huron, adjacent to the Chippewas of Kettle and Stony Point First Nation. The community is comprised of full-time residents, picturesque cottages and campgrounds. Like much of Lambton Shores, Ipperwash experiences an influx of seasonal residents as well as beach enthusiasts during the summer months.

Port Franks is a residential community nestled amongst a series of wetland areas and wooded dunes making it a nature lover's paradise. Port Franks is also known for its marina services, small businesses and restaurants.



BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

The Grand Bend and Area Chamber of Commerce and Forest BIA are located in Lambton Shores and promote the economic vitality of their community while also providing business focused resources and advocacy.

Lambton Shores has a wide range of commercial and industrial properties available for development/redevelopment. The Forest Industrial Park is located directly on Hwy. 21, only 15km (9.3m) to Hwy 402 giving users excellent proximity to the Canada/USA border. The Park features 37.6 hectares (93 acres) of land divisible to suit client requirements.
