ABOUT PLYMPTON-WYOMING

Known as The Hub of Lambton County, Plympton-Wyoming is an agricultural community located on the beautiful shores of Lake Huron and east of the City of Sarnia. Characterized by its beautiful, rolling landscapes and quaint, continuously growing town at its heart, Plympton-Wyoming is host to multiple picturesque villages and upscale lakeside residential developments that offer residents beautiful sandy beaches and breathtaking sunsets.

Residents and businesses located in Plympton-Wyoming benefit from direct access to Ontario's 400-series highways with Highway 402 bisecting the municipality at its centre. Additional highway access is provided by King's Highway 21 which offers the ability to transport goods and people north along the shores of Lake Huron.

Thanks to its close proximity and easy access to larger centres, Plympton-Wyoming is the ideal location to live and do business, and its growing population has created significant economic opportunity throughout the municipality including downtown Wyoming, the Reeces Corners highway commercial district, and the lakeside village of Camlachie.



Plympton-Wyoming is a safe and welcoming family friendly community with unique neighborhoods & landscapes. Residents from surrounding municipalities, the City of Sarnia, City of London, and Greater Toronto Area have taken notice of Plympton-Wyoming's lifestyle that includes over 16 kilometres of lakefront. As a result, the municipality is experiencing significant growth with over 17 upscale residential developments on Lake Huron and new subdivisions that continue to be developed throughout in the municipality.

Tax rates for Plympton-Wyoming are lower than that of many other municipalities in Lambton County.

Space for new businesses are readily available in the town of Plympton-Wyoming, including opportunities for full-service restaurants both locally owned and franchised, a clothing store, furniture store, and florist. Professional service opportunities also include an Office for Real Estate Agents, a Law Office, Architectural and Engineering service.

In addition to the many retail opportunities, Wyoming has available land, including highway commercial surrounding the 402 highway & Highway 21. The Municipality also has available land for investment opportunities across a myriad of sectors, including an opportunity for a small-scale hotel and restaurant for visitors looking for accommodations close to Highway 402-representing the first rest stop opportunity outside the City of Sarnia- a short 15 minute drive from the second busiest Canada-USA border crossing.

AMENITIES

Residents and visitors alike can appreciate Plympton-Wyoming's natural beauty by visiting one of the many beaches, parks, trails, conservation areas and an award-winning Estate Winery.

Plympton-Wyoming is known for having beautiful sandy beaches and breathtaking sunsets. The area is proud to have two conservation areas for residents and visitors to enjoy. The 4 hectare Charles J. McEwen Conservation Area us a great place for a swim in the clean waters of Lake Huron and a picnic. The area features a 200-meter sandy beach and a picnic area. Several species of trees have been planted to return much of the area to forest. The Highland Glen Conservation Area is 11 hectares of beautiful forested ravine land and a 600-metre beach along Lake Huron. The Conservation Area includes a boat ramp and safe harbour allowing free access to Lake Huron for boaters. Experienced and amateur anglers can fish by motorboat, canoe or by standing on shore, and enjoy a fabulous day outdoors. Lake Huron's fresh, clean waters make a scenic setting for a day out casting your line.

There are three campgrounds located within the municipality, with Lakewood Christian Campground, Paradise Valley Campground, and Country View Motel & RV Camping Resort offering a variety of short & long-term camping options.

The Town of Plympton-Wyoming is home to several parks with a diverse range of amenities including swimming pools, splash pads and activities. In the municipality residents will find modern sports and recreation facilities for baseball, ball hockey, fitness and exercise, golf, and soccer, while residents are also well served by two Lambton County Library locations in Wyoming and Camlachie.
